<p><u>Approved material underneath your stove:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Concrete Slab, bare or with any tile or brick installed above it. Pre-Fab UL approved Stove Boards and mats. Ceramic Tile, Marble, or Slate installed on top of UL listed cement underlayment board. Different stoves have different requirements, but all wood stoves need to have a non-combustible base underneath. <p style="text-align: center;"><u>Proper Clearances</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> This base should extend a minimum of 8 inches around all sides of the stove and 18 inches in front of any loading doors. In addition, the stoveboard should extend underneath and horizontal run of the stovepipe connection to the chimney. 	<p><u>Things to remember about chimneys:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> No stovepipes through Walls, Ceilings, Floors, or Windows—Use only UL Approved Chimneys. Generally speaking, the taller the better. The least amount of bends - the best upward draft. Chimneys should extend 2 feet above anything within 10 feet. Use a cap which prevents birds from entering. Consult with your Hearth Dealer, Chimney Sweep, and Building Official. Every Wood Stove needs either a masonry or metal insulated chimney. You can <u>not</u> use stovepipe through a window. You can use an existing fireplace chimney if they are partially or fully lined with approved materials. Be careful if you have a pre-fab or zero clearance fireplace - most stoves are not able to use existing chimneys in this type of unit.
